Dear Friends,

As we approach the end of the Calendar Year, it is important that we review our financial status as a Parish. This is an important evaluation, as it will directly impact our ability to follow the prepared budget with planned programming and efforts. During December, we pause to reflect on the blessings of our parish community. Our ministries, programs, and staff are the heartbeat of Holy Trinity — but they depend on meeting our planned budget.



As highlighted last week, the Diocesan Annual Campaign (DAC) supports works of charity throughout the Diocese of Harrisburg and is a needed resource for Churches and Schools. The DAC strengthens our parish and Our Lady of the Angels school, as seen recently when diocesan IT staff provided vital assistance at no cost. Please consider a gift to the DAC as we close the calendar year. At the same time, our Sunday Collection is significantly behind goal. As of November, we budgeted \$214,170.00 but received \$171,039.04 — leaving a deficit of \$43,130.96 (20% below budget).

As a reminder, the Sunday Collection — taken by the baskets during Weekend Masses, the mailing in of envelopes, and the use of the PARISH GIVING eGiving Platform, as well as PAYPAL and VENMO (notice that QR codes are newly added to the back of every hymnal to help all easily give to the Sunday Collection) — is budgeted to fund the day-to-day operations of our parish: the wages and benefits for our employees, including the Priests and Religious Sisters, and our Parish Ministries and Programs, as well as for repairs and maintenance of our buildings and grounds.

So that we can continue to have the many good works, programs, and staff that keep our Church a vibrant and strong community of faith, I am asking all to increase your weekly envelope titling to the Sunday Collection, set up a PARISH GIVING account to regularly support our Parish, or make a donation to the Sunday Collection.

Your support of the Sunday Collection is essential to the operations of our Parish.



Columbia Catholic Mental Health Ministry

The *Columbia Catholic Mental Health Ministry*, in collaboration with Holy Trinity Catholic Church & St. Peter's Roman Catholic Church, will be hosting its **Monthly Workshop on Wednesday, December 17 @ 7:00 PM at St. Peter's, 121 S. 2nd Street, Columbia, in the Social Hall** and is open to everyone in the community.

The topic of this Workshop is **Trauma Informed Care** and will feature **guest speaker Garret Book**, Lancaster Behavioral Health Hospital Patient Experience Coordinator and a Certified Trauma Professional through PESI. Garret is a 2015 graduate of Lancaster Theological Seminary where he earned a Master of Divinity. At Penn State Hershey Medical Center & Children's Hospital, he completed his Chaplaincy Internship and Residency. He worked as a staff chaplain for Lancaster General Hospital, Lancaster Rehabilitation Hospital, and Lancaster Behavioral Health Hospital from 2019 to 2023, when he took his current position.
