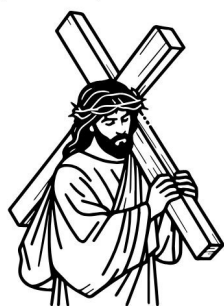


## Columbia Catholic Youth Ministry Living Stations Registration

Dear Friends,

In just a few days we will start the Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday.

**On Ash Wednesday, February 18, Ashes will be distributed at the 9:00 am Holy Mass and 6:30 pm\* Holy Mass.**

**Although, not a Holy Day of Obligation participating in Holy Mass on Ash Wednesday is a great way to begin Lent.** (\*Note: the 6:30 pm Mass on Ash Wednesday will include the use of incense. As we did in the Advent and Christmas Seasons, we will renew the use of incense at Sunday Masses during the days of Lent and the Easter Season.)

Remember as well that Ash Wednesday, along with Good Friday, is a day of Fasting and Abstaining from eating meat. The penitential disciplines of fasting and abstinence from meat oblige all Catholics from age 18 to 59 to have only one meatless meal. On these days of fasting, some food can be consumed at the other regular mealtimes, if necessary, but the combined amount of food taken at these other times should be less than a full meal. Please note that medicines and liquids are not restricted by the Lenten fast. Also, every Friday of Lent is a day of abstinence from meat. Those excused from the requirement of fasting and/or abstinence from meat are persons outside the age limits (persons under the age of 18 or over the age of 59), anyone with an illness including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses, such as diabetes, as well as pregnant or nursing mothers.

All are encouraged to receive the Mercy of God during the Season of Lent through the Sacrament of Confession; please note that our Parish Lenten Penance Service will be the **Sunday, March 15 at 2 pm.**

As we prepare for Lent, please take some time to consider how you will more sincerely enter into the spiritual disciplines of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving.

It is worth the effort to reconsider your “usual plan” and to stretch toward more intense acts of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. Lent invites us all to adopt the habit of, or to increase your time spent in, daily prayer — such as praying the Rosary, reading the Scriptures, reading the lives of the saints, and/or attending Daily Mass. When it comes to Fasting, which helps us to grow in self-control, the traditional sacrifices of abstaining from alcohol, tobacco, caffeine, desserts, and sweet drinks/treats, are always good, and I would suggest considering abstaining from social media, music or radio while driving, and television. As to Almsgiving, Lent is a privileged time for service work, volunteering, and making donations to charity, I urge all to live generously by choosing to bless others from the many blessings that we have received.

During the days of Lent through our communal penitential disciplines as well as our personal engagement in Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving we strengthen our life of faith and we root out sin, temptations to vice, or attitudes of duplicity that separate us from God.

Let us keep each other in prayer,
