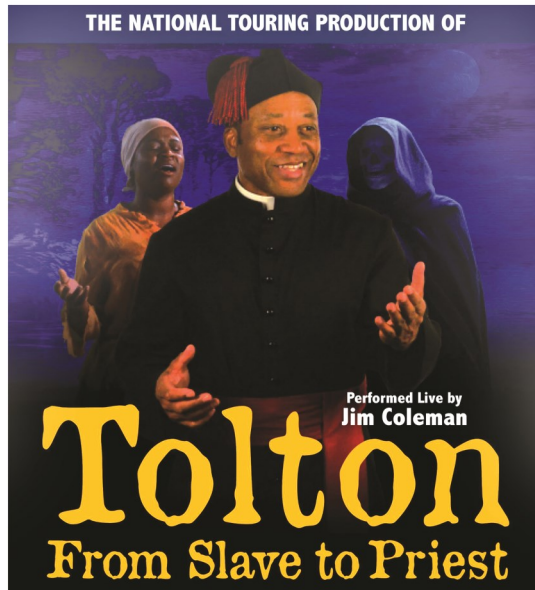


THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS
