NEW DIACONATE CLASS - Bishop Gainer has announced his invitation to pastors to nominate men who wish to consider the Permanent Diaconate. Approximately 20 men, and if married, accompanied by their spouses, will be admitted to a year of aspirancy (exploration and discernment) beginning January 2021. The program will last a total of five years. Participants will be selected taking into account projected needs of the parishes, ministries, and geography of the Diocese. Nominees must be faithful Catholic men, between the ages of 35 and 62, Catholic for at least three years, if married, in a valid and stable marriage of at least seven years, and known to the pastor of their parish. In addition, they must possess an undergraduate degree, or its equivalent, be able to undertake graduate level studies, and be gainfully employed. Applications must be obtained from the parish pastor after an initial discussion with him. Applications cannot be obtained directly from the Diocesan office. The Diaconate is an order of the Catholic clergy open to married and single men. As such, the Permanent Deacon is a member of the Church's hierarchy, who is configured to Christ the Servant through the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Applications for the Permanent Diaconate will be accepted until September 15th. A rigorous interview process will lead to admission for the 2021-2026 program.

HOLY TRINITY CHURCH GUIDELINES

GREEN PHASE

1. If you have concerns about your health or your vulnerability to infection, please stay home. Mass will continue to be live-streamed and recorded. Communion will be available in the church for a **half hour after** the Saturday 5:00 pm and Sunday 10:30 am Mass has concluded, if you would like to come after participating in the Mass remotely.
2. Everyone over 2 years old must wear masks (unless excused for medical necessity) at all times in the church and office, except for receiving communion. Gloves are not permitted for receiving communion in the hand.
3. Confessions will be offered in the church, near the St. Joseph altar, using a collapsible set-up, at the usual time (3:30-4:30 pm Saturdays). Please keep your mask on.
4. Every other pew is roped off. Please do not move the ropes.
5. Please do not socialize within the building before or after Mass.
6. Please keep social distance in the pews, in procession to receive communion, and at all other times. People who live together do not need to keep social distance from one another.
7. There will not be a collection taken. There will be a place to donate your offering near each of the doors. Thank you for your continued generosity.
8. Volunteers are needed to wipe down pews and commonly touched objects in the church after each weekend Mass.
9. During this green phase, we are able to have one or two altar servers (without vesting), but not extraordinary ministers, nor distributing the Precious Blood or sharing the Sign of Peace. Extraordinary Ministers may take communion to the home-bound, with required masks and social distancing.

PRO-LIFE UPDATES AND EVENTS

- **OUTDOOR PRO-LIFE STATIONS** - We will be holding Pro-Life Stations of the Cross outdoors at St. John Neumann Church on first Thursdays at 10:00 am for the next three months. July 2nd, August 6th, and September 3rd. Bring a lawn chair for brief discussion time afterward.
- **JULY PRAYER VIGIL** - There will be a prayer time, discussions, and social with refreshments at Long's Park at 10:00 am on Friday, July 17th. We will meet in the parking lot in front of Wegman's near Miller's Ale House. Bring a lawn chair.
- **PLANNED PARENTHOOD CLINIC** - For those of you who haven't heard, the clinic on South Lime Street closed permanently in May. According to their director, they are looking for a new building in the city and hoping to "expand" their services. So our work is not finished!
- **VIGILS** - Instead of being on South Lime Street, we will be holding vigils in the Square. All times will be from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm starting Saturday, August 22nd and Saturday, September 12th. We will then be scheduling Tuesday, Friday, and Saturday during the **Fall 40 Days for Life**. We need to be in constant prayer and greet everyone with love and a smile. Anyone who would be willing to lead a one or two hour time slot during that period, let us know.
- **YORK VIGILS** - In September, we will be joining York 40 Days for Life to pray for all the unborn babies who are aborted at York Planned Parenthood.
- **ICE CREAM SOCIAL** - We are planning to have an Ice Cream Social sometime in August. It would be pre-packed products such as Dixie Cups and Klondike Bars and bottled drinks. We are thinking of the pavilion at St. John Neumann Church.
- **NATIONAL ELECTION** - There is a VERY IMPORTANT election coming up in November. This Fall's 40 Days for Life will be a critical time for us to be visible on the Square to encourage people to vote for a Culture of Life. The results of this election will effect, not only the lives of the unborn, but the very life of the United States of America as we know it.
