Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, whose feast day is January 4, suffered from depression following the death of her husband and subsequent rejection by friends and relatives after she converted to the Catholic Church. Suffering depression so profound that she thought of suicide several times, she founded the nation's parochial school system and became the first American born saint.



Companions will have a meeting on **Saturday, January 10**, at 1:00 pm in the parish hall followed by an ice cream social. Men and women come join us and bring your




**Pine Trees** - In early January the three large pine trees at the entrance of the Church, adjacent to the stairs at the entrance of the Church and along the sidewalk for the handicap accessible entrance of the Church, will be removed. There are a few reasons for the removal

of these trees. Debris and discarded items are regularly found under the trees. The trees have outgrown the area where they are located, encroaching on sidewalk, the trees are growing into each other causing the lower branches to die, the trees are blocking the lighting at the entranceway for both the stairs and the sidewalk and when the new fencing will be installed around the front of the Cherry Street Property (on the East Side of the Church Building), in a few months, it is important that all landscaping promotes safety.

These large trees, which are overgrown, will be adjacent to a fenced entrance and thus present a safety concern. The decision to remove these trees was recommended by the Building and Grounds committee during the Summer, for the above noted reasons, and this proposal was discussed with Parish Finance Council and Parish Pastoral Council. As we move forward with improvements to our property and new landscaping we will be evaluate plantings that create an atmosphere of safety and add to beauty our property.
